Palm and Passion Sunday

March 24, 2013

Our service begins with a procession of the palms to recall the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The palms we wave reflect the fragility of the celebration—since a mere five days later, the crowd's adulation turns to hatred. In Philippians we read Paul's account of Jesus' ministry. Paul sums up the humiliation and the glory of Jesus that we honor this week. The gospel narrative is a retelling of the passion of Christ, drawing primarily from the gospel of Matthew.

Immediately following the Lord's Supper, a service of prayer for healing
will also be held. The service consists of prayers for healing and wholeness,
with anointing and laying on of hands. All are invited.*
