


#### SERVICE OF WORSHIP

All Hallows' Eve Monday, October 31, 2022, 10:30 p.m.

Tonight is the eve of All Saints' Day, the festival in the Church that recalls the faith and witness of our siblings in Christ throughout all ages. The service celebrates our continuing communion with them, and memorializes the recently deceased. The early Church followed the Jewish custom that a new day began at sundown; thus, feasts and festivals in the Church were observed beginning on the night before. The night before All Saints' (or All Hallows') became known as All Hallows' Eve, or Halloween. Our Scripture readings tonight point to Jesus, for it is by faith in him that we step from darkness into light, and from death into life.

# Gathering

The service begins in the Memorial Garden. The ushers will distribute candles.

### \*Greeting

Leader: Light and peace in Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

\*Opening Prayer | In unison:

Lord Christ, your saints have given light to the world in every generation: Grant that we who follow in their footsteps may be worthy to enter with them into that heavenly country, where you live and reign forever and ever. Amen.

\*Processsion of the Saints | The congregation will silently follow the crucifer and worship leaders inside, bearing the light with them. The choir sings the introit while the congregation processes into the chancel to be seated. If the chancel fills, please be seated in the chairs at the front of the nave.

Why these bitter words of the dying,
O brethren, which they utter as they go hence?

But whither now go the souls? How dwell they now together there? This mystery have I desired to learn, but none can impart aright. Do they call to mind their own people, as we do them? Or have they forgotten all those who mourn them and make the song:

We go forth on the path eternal, and as condemned, with downcast faces, present ourselves before the only God eternal. Where then is comeliness? Where then is wealth? Where then is the glory of this world? There shall none of these things aid us, but only to say oft the psalm: Alleluia.

If thou hast shown mercy unto man, O man, that same mercy shall be shown thee there; and if on an orphan thou hast shown compassion, the same shall there deliver thee from want.

If in this life the naked thou hast clothed, the same shall give thee shelter there, and sing the psalm: Alleluia.

Youth and the beauty of the body fade at the hour of death, and the tongue then burneth fiercely, and the parched throat is inflamed.

The beauty of the eyes is quenched then, the comeliness of the face all altered, the shapeliness of the neck destroyed; and the other parts have become numb, nor often say: *Alleluia*.

With ecstasy are we inflamed if we but hear that there is light eternal yonder; that there is Paradise, wherein every soul of righteous ones rejoiceth.

Let us all also enter into Christ, that all we may cry aloud thus unto God: Alleluia.

Response

\*Nicene Creed | In unison:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

\*The Lord's Prayer | All are encouraged to pray the Lord's Prayer in the language of their choosing. The English version is number 895 in the hymnal.

Sharing of the Bread and Wine | All who love Christ, earnestly repent of their sins, and seek to be at peace with God and neighbor are invited to receive Communion. Wine is used for Communion. If you have a gluten allergy, a server will be in the chancel with gluten-free wafers available upon request. If you will not receive Communion, you are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.

Eternal God, we give you thanks for this holy mystery in which you have given yourself to us. We praise you that through this meal you assure us that we are living members of the Body of Christ and heirs of your eternal kingdom. Grant that we may go into the world in the strength of your Spirit, to give ourselves for others, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.
