

Today's Guest Preacher | Today's Goodson Guest Preacher is the Rev. Dr. Edgardo Colón-Emeric. At Duke Divinity School, he is the dean, director of the Center for Reconciliation, and Irene and William McCutchen Associate Professor of Reconciliation and Theology. Dean Colón-Emeric's work explores the intersection of Methodist and Catholic theologies and Wesleyan and Latin American experiences. Born and raised in Puerto Rico, he was the first Latino to be ordained as an elder in the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church and was the founding pastor of Cristo Vive United Methodist Church in Durham. He became the founding director of the Hispanic House of Studies at Duke Divinity School in 2007 and joined the Divinity School faculty in 2008. Dean Colón-Emeric serves on the United Methodist Committee on Faith and Order and on both national and international Methodist-Catholic dialogues. Among other books, he wrote *Óscar Romero's Theological Vision: Liberation and the Transfiguration of the Poor*, which received first place in the 2019 Catholic Press Association award for books about newly canonized saints.

Martin about his book *Building a Bridge: How the Catholic Church and the LGBT Community Can Enter into a Relationship of Respect, Compassion, and Sensitivity.* This is the final event in the four-part series "Contemporary Conversations in Christianity," which Duke Chapel has co-sponsored along with other campus units. Spring Oratorio: Music for Troubled Times | On Sunday, April 23, at 4:00 pm, the Chapel's choirs join forces with the Mallarmé Chamber Players to present a program of choral music for anxious times. The program will include Felix Mendelssohn's cantata "Hear My Prayer" and the *Missa in Angustiis* ("Lord Nelson" Mass) by Franz Joseph Haydn, considered one of the most evocative mass settings of the Classical era. Student Photo Exhibition to Examine Muslim Identity | Selected by Duke Chapel as this year's C. Eric Lincoln Fellow in Theology and Arts, graduate student Shiraz Ahmed explores how and why local Muslim men wear beards in his exhibition *The Beards of Muslim Men*. The exhibition, which will be on display in the Chapel April 12–May 5, places photographic portraits of bearded Muslim men on stylized backgrounds. The series of images can be viewed when the Chapel is open to the public daily from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., except during private ceremonies.

Gospel Vocalist Yolanda Adams to Sing in Sunday Service | Gospel vocalist Yolanda Adams will sing in the Duke Chapel Sunday morning worship service on April 16 at 11:00 a.m. A multi-platinum recording artist with thirteen albums, Adams' music blends modern gospel with R&B and jazz. Some of her many awards and recognitions include five Grammy Awards, *Billboard* magazine's Gospel Artist of the Decade, performing at the White House, and induction into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame. In addition to her work as a gospel singer and songwriter, Adams is an actress, author, fashion designer, and entrepreneur. She is the host, creator, and owner of the nationally syndicated radio program the *Yolanda Adams Morning Show*. Through her radio show and her nonprofit, Adams has supported numerous organizations working to improve education, health, and the well-being of young people. In 2016, President Barack Obama presented her with the Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award for her volunteer service.

Carillon Recital April 30 | Lisa J. Lonie, Princeton University carillonneur, will give a recital on the Chapel's carillon on Sunday, April 30, at 5:00 p.m. The concert is part of the 2022-2023 J. Samuel Hammond Carillon Recital Series. Bring a lawn chair or blanket, and enjoy the music from the beautiful surroundings of Abele Quad. This recital, free and open to the public, is presented rain or shine.
