





Today, we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, which is Latin for “coming.” It celebrates the most important news about the past and the most important news about the future: Christ has come, and Christ will come again. This morning’s scripture readings recognize this future of Christ’s coming. The reading from Isaiah prophesies a coming peace, and the readings from Romans and Matthew speak of a coming salvation.
