


# Service of Worship

This morning we celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus, the Son of God, who was born on earth as the incarnate Christ-child, fully God and fully human. The Scriptures announce God's decisive action in the world: sending Jesus to be our Savior, and sharing in the fullness of our human lives as Emmanuel—God with us. Because on Christmas we celebrate that God came to dwell among the people, all of today's service will take place from the crossing in the nave, among the people.

The congregation is invited to reflect silently during the prelude as a time of prayer and meditation. The Chapel welcomes families with children. If at any time during the service your child needs a place for active play, please know there is a nursery in the Chapel basement.
