The Divinity School Duke University

Duke University Divinity School was established in 1926 as the first professional school to open its doors after the expansion of Trinity College into Duke University in 1924. The roots of the Divinity School, however, extend to the founding of Duke's predecessor institution in 1838, because of its strong commitment to education for the church's ministry, and its relationship to the Methodist Church. The Divinity School is one of 13 graduate professional schools of theology of the United Methodist Church and is supported generously by its Ministerial Education Fund. There are now more than 6,000 graduates of the Divinity School in all avenues of Christian ministry around the world.

The Seal of Duke University

The seal of Duke University has been in use at least since 1869. President Braxton Craven selected the motto that is on the seal in 1859 when the name of the college was changed to Trinity. Craven stated that "for a church college, the name Trinity included everything that a church college ought to stand for, and that with the motto, formed a consistent plan of Christian education." The motto probably originated from a Methodist hymn by Charles Wesley, brother of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism. Titled "Sanctified Knowledge," the third stanza begins, "Unite the pair so long disjoined, Knowledge and vital piety...."



The Divinity School Logo

The logo of the Divinity School was first designed for the embellishment of the Kilgo Portico, the main entrance of the school that honors Bishop John Carlisle Kilgo, president of Trinity College (1894-1910), and later bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. The design was perfected by the Divinity School architect from a sketch made by Richard P. Heitzenrater, then a student in the school, now William Kellon Quick Professor Emeritus of Church History and Wesley Studies. The logo shows the church as a ship in which the faithful find salvation from the storms of life. The depiction of the church as a ship derives from the earliest period of Christianity and became a symbol of the universal church. The logo expresses the ecumenical character and commitment of the Divinity School.

The Hooding Ceremony

Academic dress originated in the 13th and 14th centuries. When European universities were taking form in the Middle Ages, scholars also were clerics so they adopted robes similar to those of their monastic orders. Capes with hoods attached were needed for warmth in drafty buildings. The use of academic garb in the United States has been continuous since Colonial times, but a clear protocol only emerged when an intercollegiate commission in 1893 recommended a uniform code. In this country, the gown's design varies with the degree held. The most elaborate academic costume is the doctoral gown with velvet panels down the front and three bars of the same material across the sleeves. The velvet is usually black, but it may be a color designating the field of study to which the degree pertains. The hood has a larger symbolic role: the width of its velvet trimming designates the level of the degree; the color heralds the major field of study; and the lining identifies the institution that granted the degree. Duke Divinity School hoods are lined with Duke blue with a white chevron. They are trimmed in red velvet, the color designated for theology.
