BIOGRAPHY | Very Rev. John J. H. Hammond, V.G., J.C.L., K.H.S.



Fr. John Hammond is Vicar General and Judicial Vicar of the Diocese of Nashville, and Pastor of St. Patrick Catholic Church in downtown Nashville. In his diocesan leadership roles, Fr. Hammond oversees or directs various

diocesan offices and ministries, supervises parish and diocesan activities, and serves on most diocesan consultative and corporate boards and councils. Prior to his ordination to the Catholic priesthood in 2014, Fr. Hammond attended seminary at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, where he earned the Bachelor of Philosophy, Bachelor of Sacred Theology, Master of Divinity, and Master of Arts degrees, and served in various leadership roles, including as president of the student body, Master of Liturgical Ceremonies, Deputy Director of Human Formation, and representative to the Board of Trustees. He has also earned the Licentiate in Canon Law *summa cum laude* from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome.

Prior to entering ordained ministry, Hammond had a successful career as a church musician,

serving as Assistant Organist/Choirmaster and Acting Organist/Choirmaster at the Church of the Incarnation in Dallas, Texas, one of the largest Episcopal churches in the country. He also served as Carillonneur at the Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe in Dallas. He received the Bachelor of Arts degree *summa cum laude* from The University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee, with majors in music and Latin literature, and a minor in ancient Greek. While at The University of the South, Father Hammond functioned in multiple leadership capacities, including serving as head of student government and as a member of the University's Board of Trustees. He also holds the Master of Sacred Music degree *summa cum laude* from Southern Methodist University, where he studied organ and sacred music.

In 2001, Hammond was awarded full carillonneur membership in the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America, one of the youngest performers ever to achieve that distinction. He has presented numerous carillon recitals throughout the United States and abroad, and has published several original compositions for the instrument.

Hammond is a member of various professional and honorary societies, and is a Knight Chaplain of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.
